Resolution
Due to the enforcement of the provisions of the
Pharmacy Act, the Pharmaceutical Education Committee of the All
India Council for Technical Education has recommended that the
All India Council for Technical Education should, as far as possible, be organ-
ized in the existing polytechnics as an extension of their
activities in the field of technical education. The Government
of India have accepted the recommendation of the committee and has
requested the state Government to encourage the institutions
desirous to start the course, in order to meet the demand of
trained pharmacists. It has, therefore, been decided to
introduce the Diploma Course in Pharmacy at the following three
established polytechnics in the state from the academic year
84-85:-

- 1) Government Polytechnic, Karad.
- 2) Government Polytechnic, Jalgaon.
- 3) Government Polytechnic, Amravati.

The course will be organized as an extension of their activities
in these three polytechnics and, therefore, accorded to the
additional temporary posts as mentioned in the appended statement,
at each of the above polytechnics, for a period of 8 months from
June, 1964 upto 28th February, 1965. 7 creation of the

Sanction is also accorded to the incurring of an
expenditure of Rs. 23,500/- (Rupees twenty three thousand five
hundred) only for each polytechnic, on account of recurring
contingencies viz. Hardware, store, raw materials etc.

Sanction is also accorded to the non-recurring expenditure
of Rs. 50,000/- (Rupees fifty thousand) for each of the three
polytechnics for the purchase of equipment and furniture during
the current financial year from the list of equipment approved by
the Government of India, Ministry of Education. The equipment
and furniture should be purchased through the Director of
Industries and the Central Stores Purchasing Office. The furniture
should be purchased from Jais, Government or Government aided
institutions falling within the list of institutions and accepting
the lowest rates. The purchase should be made in accordance with
the rates contained in appendix VI of the Bombay contingent
expenditure rules, 1959.

The qualification prescribed for admission to the Diploma
Course in Pharmacy should be Matriculation or an
Examination from this state. The syllabus for

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5. The Director of Technical Education should make necessary arrangements for sending the students for training under registered Pharmacists where they are available in the State and submit necessary proposals to Government in that respect indicating the financial cost involved in the proposal and how the same is proposed to be met, in due course.

6. The expenditure on this account should be debited to the budget - head "28-Education-D-Special-L-Government-Special Schools-L-30 Schemes in the Third Five Year Plan-L-30(20) Establishment of Polytechnics in the State" and should be met from the provision made thereunder during the current financial year by way of section I New Item.
